Paradoxically, one has a lot of free time, but the summer holidays are over before they

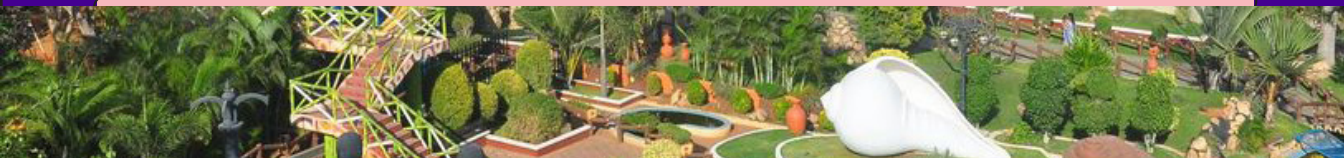

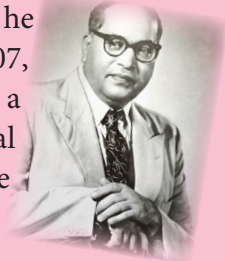

TIDBITS ABOUT DR. BR AMBEDKAR

Great man is different from an eminent one in that he is ready to be the servant of the society.

Dr. BR Ambedkar, Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar, was born on April 14, 1891, in Indore, Madhya Pradesh. He took admission to Mumbai's high school, and he was the first lower-caste student to get admission to that school. In 1907, Ambedkar passed his high school examination. This success triggered a wave of happiness among the people of his caste because it was a big deal to pass high school at that time, and it was amazing to have someone from their community achieve it.



After that, Bimrao Ambedkar obtained degrees in Economics and Political science in 1912, breaking all records in the field of study. In 1913, he went to America for post-graduation, and in 1915, at Columbia University, he did his M.A. He was awarded a PhD for one of his research projects in the following year. In the year 1916, he published the book Evolution of Provincial Finance in British India.

Dr. Ambedkar went to London in 1916 with his doctoral degree, where he studied law at the London School of Economics and enrolled in a degree programme for a doctorate in Economics.

However, the next year, after the scholarship money ran out, he had to leave his studies in the middle and return to India. After that, he came to India and did a lot of other jobs, like clerical jobs and being an accountant. He completed his research by going back to London in 1923 with the help of his remaining money. The university in London awarded Ambedkar the degree of Doctor of Science. After that, he spent his life in the service of society. He participated in many campaigns for the independence of India, wrote many books for the social freedom of Dalits, and made India an independent nation. In 1926, he became a member of the Mumbai Legislative Council. On October 13, 1935, Ambedkar was made the Principal of the Government Law College and worked on this post for 2 years.

MAY DAY – A DIFFERENT HISTORY

May Day is a European festival of ancient origins marking the beginning of summer. It is usually celebrated on 01 May, around halfway between the spring equinox and summer solstice. Festivities may also be held the night before, known as May Eve. Traditions often include gathering wildflowers and green branches, weaving floral garlands, and crowning a May queen. International Women's Day is called "May Day," but the two are unrelated. The earliest known May celebrations appeared with the Floralia, the festival of Flora, the Roman goddess of flowers, held from 27 April – 03 May during the Roman Republic era. A later May festival is celebrated in Germanic countries. Walpurgis Night commemorates the official canonization of Saint Walpurpa on May 1, 870. The best-known modern May Day traditions, observed both in Europe and North America, include dancing around the Maypole and crowning the queen of May. May Day was not established as a public holiday until Nazi Germany declared May 1 a National Worker's Day in 1933

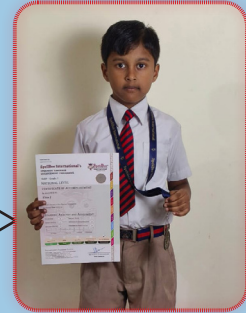

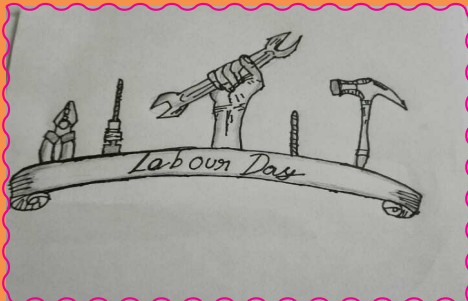

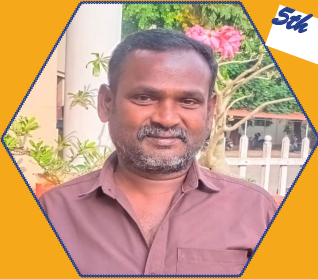
