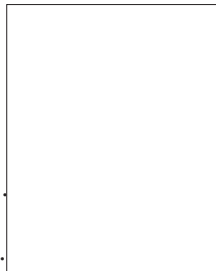

St. KURIAKOSE ELIAS CHAVARA

(Our Founder)

1805 - 1871

St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara was born at Kainakary, Kerala. He was a great visionary and a saintly priest who ventured into many humanitarian activities in his lifetime. He is the forerunner in the field of education and he is also the founder of CMI Congregation, the first indigenous religious congregation in India.*



He was a social reformer who started Sanskrit schools for the low caste people and set up old age homes, orphanages and many other socially oriented projects for the people in need.

Foreseeing the role of communication media, he established a printing press at Mannanam. He was a great orator and administrator. He was appointed as the Vicar General of the Syro-Malabar Church at a time when it had no Bishop of its own.

His commitment in protecting the downtrodden is well known. Above all, he was a sage who lived a life of prayer and commitment to the society, It was really a proud moment for Indians when he was declared a saint on 23 November 2014 by Pope Francis.

It is from his life of adventure that we draw the inspiration to carry on the task of imparting wisdom to the generations to come.

Parents are forbidden to go to classes directly to meet their wards/teachers. They are requested to contact the Principal first in case they want to meet their wards/teacher during working hours.

PROMOTION

Pupils are promoted on the basis of the whole year performance. The final examination is meant to confirm the results of the year's work. There will be no re-consideration once results of the final examinations are declared. The student who fails twice in the same class will not be allowed to continue his studies in the school.

RULES OF GOOD CONDUCT

- 1. Every pupil must have a copy of the school hand book with him/her and should bring it to the school everyday.*
- 2. English is the medium of communication in the school campus.*
- 3. While moving from class to class, lab, library, play ground etc., pupil should walk silently in line.*
- 4. Pupils who have been absent or come late will be admitted in the class only with the permission of the Principal.*
- 5. No pupil should disturb other classes at work on the flimsy plea of taking pencil or book on loan from his/her friend.*
